On January 30, 1971 John Chang, a martial artist turned businessman, contacted me. He wrote on a small card, "I am seeking the Master of Mo Pai. Please help me find this man." I just remember the excitement and frustration I felt at this request. I knew I had been searching for this man for years, and to contact him on the internet seemed almost too good to be true. I put the card on my desk and thought, "This is either a practical joke or someone's looking for me." One week later I received a small blue folder from the New York Military Academy. It was filled with drawings of what looked like Shaolin Kung Fu that had been drawn by John Chang. In addition to the drawings, there was a letter from the University of Washington. "John Chang wishes to visit with you in Seattle." That letter was signed by Dr. Paul E. Maslowski, Associate Professor of Philosophy at the University of Washington, in Seattle. A few days later, in May 1971, the Chang family arrived from Taiwan. They came to visit my home, and my family and I were told that the "master" they were seeking was my dad. We spent several days with John and his family. My parents visited the Seacrest Chinese Restaurant, and the Changs had lunch and dinner at home. During this visit, Jim and I went to the University of Washington to meet with the Changs. I remember in particular the Changs taking us to the main branch of the library and asking Jim to point to a particular book, and then pointing out where he thought my dad might be located. My dad had indeed worked in the library for many years and may have used the card that John had given to Jim. We did find my dad and brought him home. After visiting with my parents for a week, the Changs returned home. The next day, my parents received a letter from the Changs asking if Jim and I could return to Seattle to meet with them. They wanted to tell us something in person. When we returned to Seattle, we went to the University of Washington and met with the Changs again. They took us to the library. We found my dad, and when we returned home we found the Changs waiting to tell us what they had been told. We were to be the first to meet this "master." They explained that a Vietnamese man, known in martial arts circles as Mo Pai 2d92ce491b
