That surely makes the time scale of the 19th century a better fit than the 21st. More problematic is the reliance on a single author critic to determine what is literature in any given language. Once the word "greatest" is used then choice becomes a matter of self-fulfillment, and the motivation to select the best books becomes far more personal than it is for any other classification.
