To compare the efficacy of oral methylprednisolone acetate (40 mg) given daily for 4 days with that of oral prednisolone (60 mg) given daily for 4 days in the treatment of active, severe idiopathic central serous chorioretinopathy. Randomized, prospective, therapeutic trial of oral methylprednisolone (40 mg) 4 times daily for 4 days and oral prednisolone (60 mg) 4 times daily for 4 days for the treatment of active, severe idiopathic central serous chorioretinopathy. Treatment was initiated with oral prednisolone (60 mg daily for 4 days) and randomized to methylprednisolone (40 mg 4 times daily for 4 days) at day 5. Each group had complete ophthalmologic follow-up at 2 and 6 weeks; and those randomized to methylprednisolone had a follow-up at 6 and 12 months. Twenty-five patients were randomized. Fifteen patients (60%) were cured at 12 months. Four patients (16%) maintained their visual acuity at 12 months on prednisolone (2 required no treatment). The other 11 patients (44%) lost at least 1 line of vision at 12 months on prednisolone, with 4 eventually receiving additional treatments. All patients in the methylprednisolone group lost at least 1 line of vision by 6 months, necessitating additional treatment (4 patients, 16%). Oral methylprednisolone at 40 mg daily for 4 days is no more effective than oral prednisolone at 60 mg daily for 4 days in the treatment of active, severe idiopathic central serous chorioretinopathy. Although both drugs are tolerated by patients, treatment with oral methylprednisolone was associated with a greater incidence of systemic side effects than with oral prednisolone. What's up?
